The Tornjak breed has existed for hundreds of years in its countries of origin - modern day Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina as a livestock guardian dog.

Due to changing lifestyles and the effects of the world war, the breed nearly disappeared, but has been recreated since 1972 using the few dogs that remained.

Full recognition by FCI was attained in 2017.
